

Highways

- **Parish winter salt** - email supposedly sent. Have asked for copy to share
- **5mile drive**- proposed speed reduction to 50mph from county border to Bourton on the Hill
- **Speeding & Traffic volumes** - I had a good meeting with Cllr Munro et al to discuss issues relating to speeding and traffic volumes through the village. Unfortunately, GCC are removing options open to us to gather data and tackle speeding, whilst simultaneously failing to deliver on their 20mph and safer roads initiatives. I therefore advised, that energy should instead be focussed on what data we have and the potential for signage and road markings to help with speeds. In addition, I'm not sure when the PC last had speed surveys done (the rubber bands put down on the road by GCC), but these might be worth considering as an additional data gathering tool.

Council

- I was pleased to be elected as Vice Chairman of the **Commons & Rights of Way Committee**.
- Our next **Full Council** meeting will take place on the 24th May. The Conservative Group will be bringing forward a motion calling on the Council to reverse its ban on any speed reduction initiatives outside the 20mph roll-out.
- **Local government reorganisation** looks to be continuing at pace, with GCC and district/borough/city council leaders having been invited to examine terms of reference and ways of working etc for the new unitary/unitaries. We expect a Ministerial decision this summer, with elections to the new shadow unitary in May 2027.

Other

- I have continued to help local residents on a number of issues.
- I am pushing to ensure that villages and communities north of Campden are added to the **Robin Bus** network when the new contract starts in November. Weston Sub-Edge would be one of these settlements. I am also looking at whether we can add Honeybourne station to the service to help interconnectivity in the North Cotswolds.
- It is over a year since I was elected to serve Campden Vale, and it has been a huge privilege. During that time I have:
 - Helped over 500 constituents across a variety of issues
 - Spoken up for the people of Campden Vale at every opportunity in Shire Hall

- Secured thousands of pounds of funding for local community groups and charities (including youth festival, Men in Sheds, Headspace)
- Voted against any increases on council tax for hardworking families
- Helped to secure resurfacing of miles of roads in Campden Vale
- Claimed £0 in expenses
